What is this product?

Product Type: Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) Fund.

Investment Objective: The AQA Sure Fund (the "Sub-Fund") aims to achieve long-term capital growth predominantly by participating in the forex market.

Investment Policy: The Investment Manager ("We") will select and implement a series of trading strategies by predominantly investing in the EUR/USD currency pair.

We will invest in currency markets through spot foreign exchange transactions, and may utilise future contracts or other FDIs in the implementation of our trading decisions.

The overall trading strategy is based on global macroeconomic, geopolitical as well as idiosyncratic economic contexts, taking into consideration (a) interest-rates' differentials and the projection of their corresponding curves (materialised through the decisions of the respective monetary policy authorities and their interpretation by market participants), (b) inflation dynamics of the two currency areas, and (c) economic datapoints regularly released by member countries (such as unemployment, industrial production, retail sales, purchasing managers' index, etc.).

The decision of buying/selling one currency versus the other is further based on shorter-term criteria, such as news flow, price-pattern repetitions and technical indicators. The trading strategy of the Sub-Fund shall employ both mean-reverting and trend-following tactics.

Decisions of buying/ selling one currency versus the other in respect of the Sub-Fund shall be human-made, there being no algorithmic or artificial intelligence interference involved in the generation of a trading signal, entering (i.e., opening) or exiting (i.e., closing) a position.

For the implementation of its buy/sell decisions to enter/exit positions, the Sub-Fund may seek executions with its counterparts through "market" orders as well as through "standing" orders at preset levels, such as 'stop loss', 'take profit', 'limit orders', etc.

Positions entered into by the Sub-Fund (both long and short positions) are held for a period normally ranging from a few minutes to a few days. There is, however, no restriction or limitation of a minimum or maximum period for which a position may be held by the Sub-Fund.

For temporary or defensive purposes, the Sub-Fund may hold short-term fixed income instruments, money market funds and cash and cash equivalents. The Sub-Fund may also at any time hold such securities, as well as cash and cash equivalents, on an ancillary basis for cash management purposes, pending investment in accordance with its Investment Policy and to meet operating expenses and redemption requests.

Maturity: The Duration of the Sub-Fund is indefinite.

Income: This Class is an accumulator class so the income from investments held for the Class will not be paid out as dividends. Instead, income will be re-invested and reflected in the value of the Shares. The Directors reserve the right to pay Dividends at any time if they consider that a payment of a Dividend is appropriate.

Buying and Selling Shares: You may buy and sell Class A Shares (this "Class") on each business day (Monday to Friday other than public and bank holidays in Malta) subject to certain cut off times.

Currency: The Class in the Sub-Fund is denominated in EUR.

Target Investors: The Sub-Fund is generally suitable for investors willing to hold their investment for a minimum period of <u>five years</u>.

Further information about the Sub-Fund can be obtained from the Prospectus and related offering supplement as well as the latest annual and half-yearly financial reports available free of charge in English as well as in other languages of countries where the Sub-Fund is registered.

The NAV per Share will be published on the website and/or platform of the of the most recognised data providers. The NAV per Share will also be available at the offices of the Administrator and the Investment Manager.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early or you may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early. You may not be able to sell your product easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is the medium-to-low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-to-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

There is no minimum guaranteed return. You could lose some or all of your investment (see the section 'what happens if AQA Capital Ltd is unable to pay out').

Be aware of currency risk. You may receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Liquidity Risk - While the Sub-Fund shall generally invest in financial instruments which are sufficiently liquid, under certain circumstances these may also be exposed to low liquidity levels.

Duplication of Fees – Given that the Sub-Fund may invest in other collective investment schemes, there may be a risk of duplication of fees and commissions charged against the capital of the Sub-Fund.

Exchange Rate Risk – The Sub-Fund may invest in assets denominated in currencies other than Euro, thereby exposing the Sub-Fund to fluctuations in exchange rates.

Operational/Counterparty Risk – The Sub-Fund may be exposed to operational/counterparty risk following any delegation made by the Custodian.

Financial Derivative Instrument Risk – The Manager may make use of FDIs which can be highly volatile and expose investors to a high risk of loss.

Charges and Expenses - Charges and expenses will be charged against capital, which may have the effect of constraining capital growth.

The Sub-Fund may also be exposed to additional risks which are not adequately captured by the risk indicator and may cause additional loss.

Performance Scenarios

The table below shows the money you could get back over the next 5 years, under different scenarios, assuming an investment of EUR 10,000. The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products. The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance based on evidence from the past on how the value of this investment varies and are not an exact indicator. What you get will vary depending on how the market performs and how long you keep the investment. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances, and it does not take into account the situation where we are not able to pay you.

What happens if AQA Capital Ltd is unable to pay out?

What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs. The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest EUR 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

Costs Over Time
